

An Introduction to Dartmouth

Having departed from Southampton, the Mayflower and Speedwell didn't get far before the Speedwell began to take on water again.

They arrived in Dartmouth on 23rd August and, according to passengers, the Speedwell was leaking heavily and required urgent attention.

There were several shipyards on the river at this time, with skilled shipwrights on hand to make the repairs to the Speedwell. Both ships would have anchored in the river near Bayards Cove, which is the old harbour quay.

While much has changed on the waterfront, the Tudor Bayards Cove Fort, Agincourt House now Bayards Cove Inn, houses on Lower Street and Smith Street - the medieval centre of town - are well preserved, and it is easy to imagine what the town would have looked like in 1620.

It took around a week for the shipwrights to rectify the damage before they headed out into the English Channel again, bound for the North Atlantic.



Half Day Suggested Itinerary

Dartmouth Castle (1.5 hour approx.) One of the most beautifully located fortresses in England. For over 600 years Dartmouth Castle has guarded the narrow entrance to the Dart Estuary and the busy, vibrant port of Dartmouth. It offers stunning views of the estuary and out to sea and offers a great family day out, whatever the weather.

This fascinating complex of defences was begun in 1388 by John Hawley, privateering Mayor of Dartmouth and the prototype of the flamboyant 'Shipman' in Chaucer's Canterbury Tales. Climb to the top for breathtaking views across the estuary and see how it could be blocked in wartime by a heavy chain.



There is plenty to do inside the castle and if the weather is fine, you can make it a full day out with a river boat trip from the town quay up to the castle, landing you a minute's walk away from the castle entrance. After you have explored the castle, you can visit a riverside tea room for light lunches and snacks. Walkers will love the coastal and woodland walks around the castle where you can spot plenty of wildlife and birds.



Bayards Cove Fort

(30 mins approx.)

This Tudor fort, built between 1522 and 1536, contained heavy guns to protect Dartmouth harbour town from attack. The fort sits in Bayards Cove, the site where The Mayflower and The Speedwell departed Dartmouth. It was the last line of defence against enemy ships that had eluded Dartmouth and Kingswear castles.

Dartmouth Museum

(2 hours approx.)

Dartmouth Museum is a small fascinating Museum, offering an insight into Dartmouth's intriguing history. Housed in the historic Butterwalk building, the collections are wide ranging, everything from the maritime history of Dartmouth, to its physical development throughout the years.



Things to do

Start Point Lighthouse

The 150 year old Start Point Light House sits on one of the most southerly points in Devon. It provides stunning views of the coastline.

Enjoy the delights of the range of independent shops and cafes selling superb quality wares and local produce.




Dart Marina Hotel

Britannia Royal Naval College (1.5 hours approx.)

With a heritage spanning over 150 years, Britannia Royal Naval College at Dartmouth is an essential place to visit for any visitor with an interest in British history. Tour guides reveal voyage from past glories to the present day. You will be taken into the heart of the College, from the elegant Chapel, through to areas including the Quarterdeck, Parade Ground, Senior Gun Room and Britannia Heritage Museum. Since 1863, Dartmouth and the River Dart have been the home of initial Naval Officer training in the UK. Today, it is the only remaining Naval College in the country, fulfilling a vital role in training Naval cadets not only from Britain but those from the Commonwealth and all over the world.




