

An Introduction to Harwich

From the International Port of Harwich, visitors can explore the historic town of Harwich that has links to the Mayflower and many other voyages.

The Mayflower is believed to have been built in Harwich sometime before 1600, and was commanded and part-owned by her Master, Captain Christopher Jones, whose house still stands on Kings Head Street near the Waterfront.

Existing records show that Jones sailed the original Mayflower to Norway, the Mediterranean and France, exporting woollen cloth and importing wine – although he had never made the transatlantic crossing before.

In about 1611, Jones decided to leave Harwich, and move south to Rotherhithe in London, a mile downstream on the Thames from the Tower of London.

Harwich Guildhall

(1 hour approx.)

Set in the heart of the historic old seaport, Harwich's Guildhall is a Grade I listed building. Originally the site of an inn named 'The Bear' it was purchased by the council in 1673. Its present design dates from 1769 and it remains the meeting place and administrative home for Harwich Town Council.

The wealth of history and heritage that it contains, along with its remarkable architecture, make the Guildhall in Harwich a fascinating place to visit.

Ha'penny Pier

(1 hour approx.)

One of the UK's only surviving wooden, working piers, attracts thousands of visitors to Harwich each year.

Constructed in 1853 it was a popular departure point for paddle steamers until the First World War. The name of the pier originates from the ½d (half an old penny) toll that was charged.

Today, the charming and typically 19th century ticket office is home to the local historical society. The Visitor Centre is open daily from 1 May to 30 September and free guided tours of Old Harwich run every Wednesday and Saturday in the summer at 2pm.



Full Day Suggested Itinerary

RHS Garden Hyde Hall (3 hours approx.)

Located in the Essex countryside, just outside Chelmsford, this peaceful garden is a perfect destination for a day out or as part of a group tour in the East of England. With its wide open skies and far reaching views, it has an eclectic combination of different gardens, with some 145ha (360 acres) to explore.





Colchester Zoo (4 hours approx.)

Situated in Colchester, England. The zoo opened in 1963 and celebrated its 50th anniversary on 2 June 2013. It is home to many rare and endangered species, including big cats, primates and birds as well as a large number of invertebrates and fish species.

Colchester Zoo has always cared passionately about the world's threatened species, and created its charity Action for the Wild to assist conservation projects worldwide. This includes its own project, the UmPhafa Private Nature Reserve in KwaZulu Natal, South Africa. Since receiving charity status in 2004 Action for the Wild has donated over £1.2million to conservation programmes, as well as supporting conservation research.
